Boulder County is working on a stream restoration project along Wagonwheel Gap Road in Fourmile Creek Canyon. Stream restoration will help to improve the safety of the community and protect property during future high water events. Stream restoration will also improve habitat, water quality and protect culverts, bridges and the road.

Stream Restoration Project Participant Agreements are required for all projects that happen on private land. Your signature allows us to move forward with stream restoration activities including planning, construction and operation and maintenance. Your signature also demonstrates support for this important project, which helps us secure funding resources.

More Information on the Stream Restoration Project Participant Agreement

- The Participant Agreement is only for stream restoration activities outlined on the form. We will not be looking at any part of your property that is not related to creek restoration efforts.
- We will not change anything on your property without your permission.
- Boulder County and its representatives will give you at least 24 hours' notice by e-mail or phone before entering your property.
- Funding sources require a 3 year project area monitoring term, but we don't expect to need access after construction except for occasional operations and maintenance activities.
- Stream restoration and road reconstruction activities are being coordinated by Boulder County. Construction could start as early as Fall 2016. Many property owners are also being asked to sign a separate form for road construction because the projects have different needs. The roads Permission to Enter forms are only for survey work (for road or stream projects), while the stream restoration Participant Agreement covers survey, construction and operation and maintenance. The road construction will also require temporary and permanent easements from some property owners. TRS Corporation is helping obtain forms for the road construction.
