



BOULDER COUNTY ISSUES SURVEY – 2012

Methodology

The 2012 Boulder County Issues Survey was conducted on behalf of the Boulder County by Talmey-Drake Research & Strategy, Inc., a public opinion research firm in Boulder, Colorado. The results of this survey are based upon 605 telephone interviews with Boulder County voters. Boulder County provided a random sample of voter telephone numbers, which Talmey-Drake then randomly sampled. Interviews were conducted from May 7 to 14, 2012. Quotas were established to obtain approximately equal numbers of males and females as well as approximate age and geographic distribution. Random samples of 605 have worst-case 95% confidence interval of plus or minus 4.0% about any one reported percentage.

10. Next I would like to ask you a couple of questions about the RTD FasTracks program. Originally, FasTracks was going to provide commuter rail service between Denver, Louisville Boulder and Longmont, by the year 2020. But because the projected cost of this commuter rail service has increased dramatically, going from eight hundred ninety million dollars to one point seven billion dollars, RTD recently voted to change their FasTracks plan from the originally planned commuter rail service to a rail-bus hybrid project. This decision would have postponed the building of the last segment of the rail service, which was supposed to go from Westminster to Longmont. Instead, by the year 2022, FasTracks would complete dedicated bus rapid transit and high occupancy vehicle lanes from Denver to Boulder along US 36; from Boulder to Longmont along the Diagonal Highway, and bus rapid transit along Highway 287 between Longmont and US 36, with a commitment to extend the commuter rail from Westminster to Louisville, Boulder and Longmont by 2032 if future funding becomes available. Now, RTD has decided to postpone until 2013 a decision on how to address the needs of people in Boulder County, including a possible sales tax increase. Statement A. [Some/Other] people say that bus rapid transit can be built much sooner, will be more convenient, more frequent and faster than commuter rail, and will carry more riders at lower cost than commuter rail. So we should invest more money now in bus rapid transit, even if means that the extension of commuter rail service between Westminster and Louisville, Boulder and Longmont will be delayed even further beyond the projected year 2032 completion date.

Statement B. [Others/Some] say that we should not be building more bus rapid transit lanes if it means delaying the time commuter rail service will be completed. After all, commuter rail service is what we originally voted for back in 2004, it will attract riders who will not ride a bus, it will be more comfortable, and is necessary for a world class region. So the sooner we can complete the commuter rail service between Westminster and Louisville, Boulder and Longmont, the better.
