

Long-term Flood Recovery

From help with basic needs to working with FEMA, avoiding foreclosure, or paying for a longer-term rental, we are here to help make recovery easier for you.

- **Benefits**
 - Rental assistance, food assistance, financial assistance, and help accessing medical care
- **Resource Navigation**
 - FEMA coordination, service referrals and case management, mountain community assistance, and housing location services
- **Foreclosure Prevention**
 - Counseling services to help you avoid foreclosure, and assistance in negotiating with lenders to defer payments
- **Housing Rehab/Repair and Weatherization**
 - Flood rehabilitation and repairs, and emergency weatherization services
- **Planning for More Housing Options**
 - We are collaborating with town officials and other organizations to find locations for projects that will help increase Boulder County's affordable housing supply; we are also ramping up current housing developments in other parts of the county

What does recovery look like?

The September 2013 flooding destroyed several hundred homes and structures in Boulder County, resulting in tens of millions of dollars in losses. At the same time, many other homes were damaged, as was a significant amount of personal and public property.

The damage done by the flooding has had far-reaching effects, as well. Some people are finding it difficult to cover mortgages for damaged or destroyed homes. Others lost time at work because of flooding impacts, which led to lost income. And many have been hit hard emotionally by the rapid change and uncertainty.

At Boulder County Housing and Human Services, we believe a strong community is measured by its response during times like this. We'll continue to reach out to our neighbors with the help we can provide. Because we are all in charge of what this recovery looks like, and we know everyone deserves a chance to get back on their feet.
