- WERF Nutrient modeling of Boulder Creek – recap of Brown and Caldwell presentation
 - pH averages 10 above Coal Creek
 - Phosphorous reduction would have a larger impact than nitrogen reductions
 - No flow meter and high TSS at Coal Creek and Boulder Creek confluences
 - BC 107 impaired for benthic
- Watershed monitoring report discussion going forward:
 - WWTP data yea or nay
 - Parameters for all locations

- QA/QC data yea or nay
 - Additional sampling locations for Superior and Longmont
 - The Partners asked for an email to vote.
- St. Vrain 319 Watershed Plan was reviewed by Jane Clary of Wright Water for the group's benefit. She focused on the Implementation Chapter 7.
 - Submit any other planning documents not currently referenced.
 - The recently released 303d list will be captured.
 - Selenium is listed for Coal Creek and Rock Creek. Consider lobbying for a site specific standard.
 - Chase Dryden is pursuing E. coli sampling with DNA speciation locally. Janice will email Chase the price list and contact information for lab in Florida.
 - Consider loads that need to be reduced by 50%, priorities.
 - Implementation costs are included.
 - Left Hand metal issues are acknowledged.
 - The group asked that the reference to the additionally sampling locations be moved to the monitoring plan instead.
 - Jane will email out a link to drop box which will contain the report and appendices.
 - Comments are due to Jane September 4.
 - Report due to CDPHE October 1.

- Final SOW and mid-year went out with agenda.
